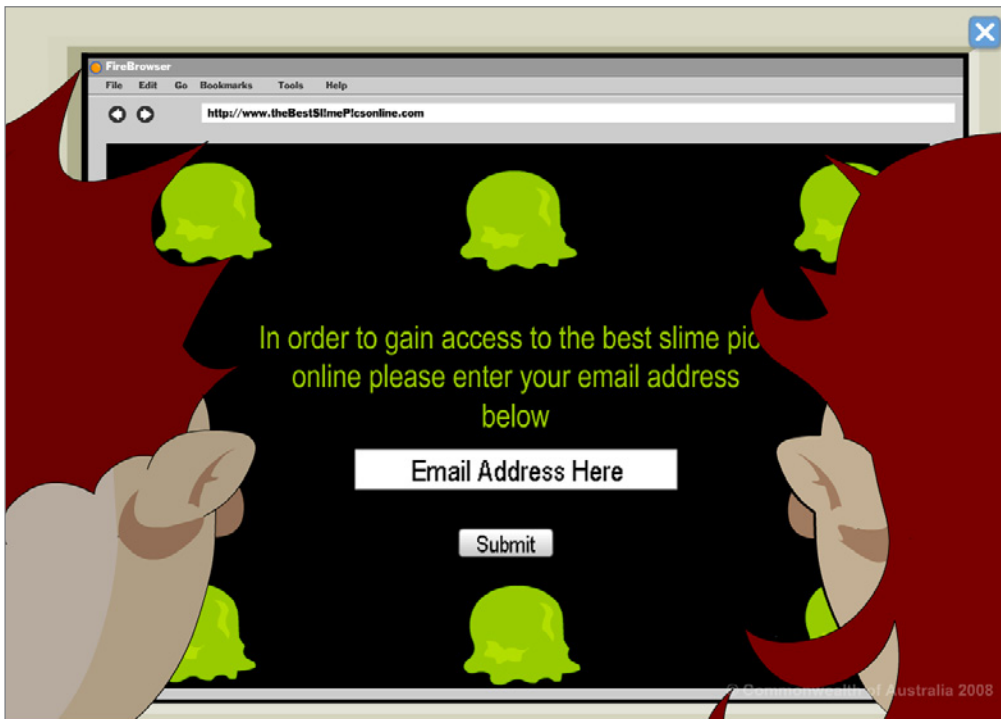


## Looking for some slime pics

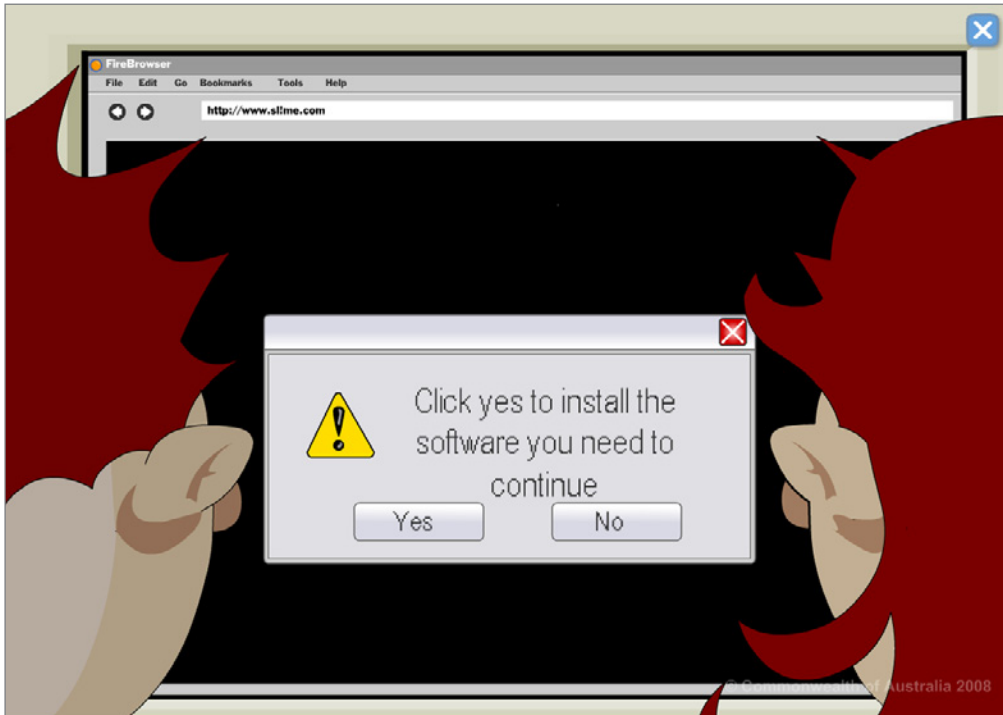
Which cousin do you agree with?
